



GATHERING ZONES make space for welcoming in diverse local residents and cultural groups for community cookouts, performances, celebrations, and learning activities.








**COMMUNITY VALUES:** First, the 29 community participants chose five BlackSpace Manifesto Principles to guide the project. Inspired by the principles, research, and storytelling, BlackSpace facilitators surveyed neighbors to develop priority social values for the physical space: a green oasis, culture, safety and welcome, and unity.

REDESIGN RECOMMENDATIONS: BlackSpace created a schematic site plan and social design recommendations tailored to RHI's chosen Manifesto principles and community values. The redesign included spaces for art, multilingual signage for navigation, and street-facing community events.
